REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING

The Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia, held their regular monthly meeting on Monday, December 3, 2001 in their office in the Courthouse Annex in the City of Griffin, Spalding County, Georgia, beginning at 6:00 o'clock p.m. with Commissioners Martha McDaniel, Merrill Massengale, Dick Morrow, Johnie McDaniel and Michael Kendall present. Also present were County Manager William Wilson, Assistant County Manager Michael Sabine, County Attorney Jim Fortune and County Clerk Phyllis Doane.

1. Mr. Scott Bombard, 520 Brookwood Terrace, stated that he did a small sign for Mr. Tom Brown, who owns a small business, approximately three (3) weeks ago and when he went to require a permit for the sign, he was told that it required an engineering sealed drawing and a site survey, which both would be more expensive than the sign itself. He said that he feels the problem is the generalization of the sign ordinance and wanted to raise this concern.

2. Mr. Tom Brown, 1245 N. Hill Street, stated he owned the small business and appealed to the Board that as a small business owner advertising is essential for the business itself and to be able to erect just a simple sign and half it cost three times as much as the sign itself, it really hurts his business. He said that this ordinance is very stringent on his business and well as other small business owners. He asked the Board to consider amending this ordinance so everybody can reap from it.

County Manager Wilson stated that in the current sign ordinance, in its wording, there is no differential in any size sign and this has been brought to the attention of staff. We feel

that there is an error in the way it is written. The Board was in agreement that the wording needed to be corrected and directed staff to request that the Planning Commission proceed with addressing this issue in the UDO.

3. Mr. Robert McIntyre, 124 Magnolia Drive, stated he was in favor of changing the name of the Akin Fire Station to Robert Fire Station in order to obtain the donation of the 1941 Ford tire truck. He said that he owns the other fire truck that belonged to Dundee Volunteer Fire Department and he paid \$4,000 for it. He asked the Board to take this into consideration.

VIII. MINUTES

1. Consider approval of the minutes for Reapportionment Public Hearing and Extraordinary Session of November 19, 2001 and also Zoning Public Hearing of November 29, 2001. *Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel the minutes were approved by a vote of 4-0-1 with Commissioner Johnie McDaniel abstaining giving the reason he was not in attendance for any of these meetings.*

X. OLD BUSINESS

1. **Lift from the table.** Commissioner Kendall would like to discuss funding priorities for the Griffin-Spalding County Hospital Authority. *Upon motion by Commissioner Johnie McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Morrow the item was lifted from the table by a unanimous vote of 5-0.*

Commissioner Kendall addressed the funding of the Hospital Trust monies as far as grants are concerned. It was discussed previously that the Hospital Authority fund the County's contributions to the Health Department. He said that he needed input and direction from this Board as to their opinion to the highest and best use of this money. He said that all of the money has not been utilized for direct health related issues and some members of the Authority feel that this should be re-examined and get direction. He said that there were annual grants as well as multi-year grants. He said that the Authority works on a calendar year and the Board needed to decide if they wanted to ask for funding for the Health Department. County Manager Wilson stated that the county's portion in funding the Health Department and Personal Growth Center is \$400,000 and recommended that the Hospital Authority grant this amount to us for FY 2003.

XI. NEW BUSINESS

1. Consider approval of new Alcoholic Beverage License for 2001 Retail Package Store, Beer, Wine & Liquor for the following:

- Mesfin Asress Mengesga d/b/a Carver Package Store, 1557D Williamson Rd.

Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel the license was approved by a vote of 4-1 with Commissioner Johnnie McDaniel voting against the motion.

2. Consider agreement in final form with Georgia Department of Motor Vehicles and with Georgia Technology Authority as requested by the Tax Commissioner to provide motor vehicle tag renewals via the Internet. *Upon motion by Commissioner Martha McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Morrow the following agreements were unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.*

**Agreement to Enable Georgia Citizens to Renew Vehicle Registrations via Internet
Between
Georgia Department of Motor Vehicle Safety
And
Spalding County**

The Constitution of Georgia authorizes intergovernmental agreements whereby state departments may contract with counties "for joint services, for the provision of services, or for the joint or separate use of facilities or equipment; but such contracts must deal with activities, services or facilities which the parties are authorized by law to undertake or provide." Ga. Const. Art. IX, §III, ¶I(a). Georgia law expressly authorizes the instant agreement for the joint use of facilities and equipment. O.C.G.A. § 40-2-22.

This agreement between the Department of Motor Vehicle Safety (DMVS) and Spalding County is effective the 3rd day of December, 2001.

DMVS has developed a web-based application that interacts with the Georgia Registration and Titling Information System (GRATIS) which allows Georgia citizens to renew their vehicle registrations over the Internet.

Spalding County is a partner with DMVS and uses GRATIS to transact its tag and title business. Spalding County desires to make Internet tag renewal available to its citizens.

DMVS and Spalding County agree to the following:

DMVS will:

1. Develop, maintain, and host a reasonably secure Internet site where the citizens of Georgia may renew their vehicle registration as described in the "Web Renewal Requirements Document".
2. Incorporate changes and interfaces to the existing GRATIS system to support web renewals.
3. Develop and maintain an interface to Georgia Technology Authority's (GTA) payment processing module.

4. Provide second level technical support to the county as is currently in place for the GRATIS system.
5. Provide training to Spalding County personnel
 - To prepare county staff to respond to support queries concerning use of the web site
 - To inform county staff of changes to the GRATIS system related to web renewals
 - To make county staff aware of GTA's web-based reconciliation process

Spalding County will:

1. Enter into a Financial Transaction Agreement with Georgia Technology Authority (GTA) for payment processing.
2. Obtain all necessary approvals from governing bodies to accept credit card and electronic check payments as outlined in the Financial Transaction Agreement with GTA.
3. Obtain all necessary approvals from governing bodies to collect a processing fee to cover the cost of payment processing (if so elected).
4. Obtain all necessary approvals from governing bodies to pay transaction fees including the per transaction fee, monthly fee, discount fee and other fees as outlined in the Financial Transaction Agreement with GTA.
5. Assume responsibility for payment processing fees and costs associated with the county's merchant account as outlined in the Financial Transaction Agreement with GTA.
6. Be responsible for financial reconciliation which will require Internet access to GTA's web site.
7. Be responsible for printing and mailing registration decals.
8. Provide all customer support including phone, e-mail, and walk-in.
9. Add any desired links from the county's web site to the DMVS site for web renewals.
10. Understand that access for residents of the county will not be available until the second month after notification to DMVS that the county will participate in Web Renewal, completion of all necessary steps, and approval of the county's request by DMVS. DMVS will furnish notice of the initial date upon which Web Renewal will be available for that county's residents.

11. Provide the following information for publication on the web site or for use in calculating processing fees (see attached form) :

- Spalding County contact telephone number to be published on the web site
- Spalding County contact e-mail address to be published on the web site
- Spalding County tag office location address (not mailing address) to be published on the web site.
- Branch number where all county's web activity is to post. This may be a new or existing branch. DMVS recommends that all activity be segregated to branch number "W".
- Indicate whether Spalding County will cover the entire cost of processing payments to the citizen, or cover part and pass along part to the citizen.
- If Spalding County wishes to pass along part of the cost of processing payments to the citizen indicate how much the county will cover and how much will be passed to the citizen. *Note: Any cost passed along to the Georgia citizen cannot exceed the actual cost to process that individual's renewal. This limits charging the citizen in excess of the per transaction fees as outlined in the Financial Transaction Agreement with GTA.*
- Spalding County may change any information contained in this section, by providing written notification to DMVS prior to the effective date of change. The attached form may be used.

1. During the performance of this Agreement, the parties agree to abide by the terms of Executive Order 11246 on nondiscrimination and will not discriminate against any person because of race, color, religion, sex or national origin. The participants will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed without regard to their race, color, religion, or national origin.
2. No member of or delegate to Congress, or resident Commissioner, shall be admitted to any share or part of this Agreement or any benefit that may arise therefrom; but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this Agreement if made with a corporation for its general benefit.
3. The parties agree that in any contracts to be developed and awarded pursuant to this Agreement all work and procedures related to said contract, shall, at all times, conform to the applicable Federal and State laws, rules, regulations, orders and approvals, including specifically, procedures and requirements relating to labor standards, equal employment opportunity, nondiscrimination, compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act, anti-solicitation, information, auditing and reporting provisions.

The covenants herein contained shall, except as otherwise provided, accrue to the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

Georgia Technology Authority (GTA) will provide an Internet payment processing application to Spalding Tax Commissioner's Office for the purpose of collecting citizens' tag fees and ad valorem taxes. Specifically, two payment options will be available for use: e-Check and credit card. This will include the acceptance of MasterCard and Visa credit cards only. Payment processing for e-Checks will be handled through Wachovia Bank of Georgia. Payment processing for credit cards will be handled through Wachovia Merchant Services utilizing the VeriSign Internet gateway. Credit card processing will be available on December 1, 2001 and e-Checks will be available no later than January 1, 2002.

Electronic Fund Transfers

Receipts from the credit card processing will be credited directly to Spalding Tax Commissioner's bank account daily. The credit card transactions will clear in one

business day if the county's demand deposit account is with Wachovia, otherwise the transactions will clear in two business days. Therefore, the daily credit card deposits will be comprised of the total Visa and MasterCard transactions captured from the previous one or possibly two days. These transfers will occur on a daily basis year round, except for weekends and bank holidays.

Receipts from e-check transactions will be remitted to Spalding Tax Commissioner's bank account via ACH bank transfer from GTA on a daily basis year round, except for weekends, and state and bank holidays. GTA will build an ACH credit file to disburse funds to the county. Daily transfers will lag 3 days. This lag allows GTA to collect compensating funds that should cover all ACH and account maintenance fees. Therefore, your county will pay no transaction fees for e-check processing. Returned checks will not be held by GTA. Any e-Check that is returned will be deducted in the next ACH bank transfer to the county. It will be the responsibility of the county to handle these disputes with the customers.

Spalding Tax Commissioner's Office will process refunds through its own business office. No refund activity against credit cards or other payment options will occur through GTA.

Credit Card Fees

Wachovia Merchant Services will assess a \$6 flat fee for each Visa or MasterCard transaction. Wachovia Merchant Services will bill the fees to Spalding Tax Commissioner's Office around the 15th of the month for the previous month's activity. The county agrees to pay the Wachovia Merchant Services' invoice by the end of the month in which the bill was received. The county will be given access to Moneta (Wachovia Merchant Services internet based reporting system) to reconcile with their monthly bank statement.

VeriSign Fees

VeriSign charges a set-up fee of \$495.00. Ongoing VeriSign fees consist of a monthly access charge of \$20.00, plus \$0.20 per transaction. VeriSign will mail a monthly invoice to the Spalding Tax Commissioner's office. The invoice terms will be Net 30.

e-Check Processing and Fees

Wachovia Bank of GA will process e-Checks through the ACH system. GTA will initiate and transmit a daily ACH debit file to Wachovia to debit each citizen's bank account for the tag and ad valorem fees. GTA will receive credit for the previous day's e-check business the following business day. GTA will hold these funds for 3 business days (to include the day credit is received plus two additional business days). On the 4th business day, an ACH credit file will be transmitted to Wachovia to credit the Spalding bank account for their e-Checks. The credit to the county's bank account will be equal to the gross fees collected less ACH returns processed that day. Spalding Tax Commissioner's Office will be responsible for the NSF returns or rejects and the collection of those funds through its own business office. The timing of credits to the county's bank account will depend on the bank with which the county does business.

ACH fees and account maintenance fees, including debit fees, credit fees, ACH Return fees, file maintenance fees, etc. will be debited directly to GTA's Wachovia bank account. By holding funds for 3 business days, GTA will offset the fees with the earnings allowance generated by the account balance. Therefore, no e-Check fees will be passed on to your county.

Reporting

Spalding Tax Commissioner's Office may designate a person or persons to have access to GTA's intranet reporting system. The activity report will summarize e-Check transactions and provide drill-down capability for additional detail. The report will show number of transactions, gross sales, returns (if applicable), and net sales. The report will be used by GTA for e-Check reconciliation purposes as well as the basis for ACH transfers of e-Check totals from GTA to the Spalding Tax Commissioner's bank account. Additional credit card and e-Check reporting for the county offices will be available via GRATIS. Access to the merchant statement will be through Wachovia's Moneta online report system. GTA will provide assistance, upon request, regarding the reconciliation of e-Check sales to Spalding Tax Commissioner's Office.

Change Procedures

If the aforementioned credit card rate changes, then this agreement will be modified and the county has the option of signing the addenda with the new fee. Also, the aforementioned compensating balance will be reviewed periodically to ensure that GTA is indeed offsetting the fees associated with e-Check processing. It may be necessary for GTA to hold funds for a longer period of time or to pass on some of the costs associated with e-Checks. If this occurs, then this agreement will be modified and the county has the option of signing the addenda with different terms. If the county chooses not to accept the new terms, then this agreement is void.

3. Consider renaming of Akin Fire Station to Roberts Fire Station. In return for the renaming of the Akin Fire Station to Roberts Fire Station, the 1941 Ford fire truck that was used by the Dundee Volunteer Fire Department would be donated to the Spalding County Fire Department. Mr. Kenneth Roberts was the Fire Chief of the old Dundee Volunteer Fire Department.

Upon motion by Commissioner Martha McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Johnnie McDaniel Akin Fire Station was renamed the Roberts Fire Station by a unanimous vote of 5-0.

4. Discuss distribution of 5% Victim Assistance Program fines as requested by Sheriff Stewart. Miss Linda Jeffries, Sheriff Stewart, District Attorney Bill McBroom and Judge Sid Esary were all present to discuss this item.

Miss Jeffries address the Board and said that they would not be duplicating services as they were first responders as they would be on the crime scene, get them to a safe place, stabilize them and when there is an arrest made and when they go into the court, turn them over to the court system. She said that it was going to take both programs working together and we can compliment each other.

Mr. McBroom stated that he has been in control of the Victim Assistance program since 1995. He said that it was the commissioner's decision, if there is more than one in the county, how the money shall be distributed. He said that Judge Esary is implementing some new programs and he is going to hire someone and that person would be a circuit employee. Mr. McBroom stated that he would be handling the city and county cases and the first responder program only handles the county cases. He said that 75% to 80% of the people are not going to be handled by the Sheriff's victim assistance program.

The Board stated that they did not want to make this decision on distribution of funds and requested that all parties involved with both victim assistance programs meet and decide on the highest and best use of this money and come up with an amicable distribution of funds to benefit both programs.

Motion made by Commissioner Martha McDaniel that all parties involved, Sheriff Stewart, Linda Jeffries, Judge Esary and District Attorney McBroom, meet and come back with a report on the agreement they have reached at the commissioner's second meeting in January, which is January 21, 2002 to give you time to get your plan in place. Commissioner Kendall seconded the motion and motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.

5. Commissioner Kendall would like to discuss creation of an additional gym supervisor position. Mr. Kendall reminded the Board that they had to create a position last year so that the Basketball Assoc. could access to gyms at the school and they only way to do it, is have an official employee to Parks and Recreation Department.

Commissioner Kendall made a motion to request this position again on an as-need basis for access to Kelsey Gym and the Basketball Association will pay the entire cost of this seasonal employee. Also part of his motion was the Basketball Assoc. would pay half the cost of the current seasonal employee's salary. Commissioner Martha McDaniel seconded the motion and motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.

6. Commissioner Morrow would like to address appointment of additional Airport Master Plan Study Committee member. *Motion made by Commissioner Morrow to appoint **Ms. Connie Bowlin**, 95 Cedar Ridge Airport Road, to replace him on the Airport Master Plan Study Committee. Commissioner Massengale seconded the motion and motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.*

7. Consider at first reading an ordinance amending the Spalding County Code to provide for "No Thru Trucks" on Rehoboth Road. *Upon motion by Commissioner Martha*

McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Johnnie McDaniel the ordinance was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0. The Ordinance will be incorporated into the minutes on second and final reading.

8. Consider declaring certain county vehicles and equipment surplus property and authorizing liquidation by means of sealed bid. *Upon motion by Commissioner Martha McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Morrow the following vehicles were declared surplus and were authorized to be sold by sealed bid, leaving if county employees could bid on vehicles to the discretion of the county manager, by a unanimous vote of 5-0.*

Chairman Massengale called for a five-minute recess before discussing item number 9.

Chairman Massengale called the meeting back to order.

9. Consider adoption of Resolution recommending a redistricting plan to the County's General Assembly delegation for introduction as a local act. The majority of the Commissioners were in favor of waiting until December 17th to vote on one of the maps. There was a lengthy and spirited discussion regarding the recommendation of a map. The Board of Commissioners had made a trip to Atlanta and drew up three (3) map plans and Commissioner Martha McDaniel, after the happenings of the events that lead up to the City election, went back to Atlanta and drew up a fourth map for review and asked that it be considered also. She said that the other three (3) maps were not progressive and we need to look towards the future ten (10) years from now and that is what her map does. Commissioner Johnie McDaniel commented that they, the Board, had not really discussed the maps and their relative position toward each of them. Commissioner Kendall and Commissioner Morrow stated that were both in favor of map number 2 as they felt like as a whole Board it represented what they wanted to accomplish, which was to try to correct the problem with one person one vote and to try to leave the districts as close as possible as they were without drastic reconstruction of the districts and have some city and county in each district. Commissioner Massengale stated that he was in favor of map number 3 or number 4 as this would put all or part of the Birdie Community back into his district. Commissioner Johnie McDaniel stated that map number 4 would be the most advantageous to him but he wanted to do the right thing and what is the best thing to get a county map approved without opposition. Commissioner Johnie McDaniel stated that he had not heard any discussion regarding map number 1. Commissioner Kendall commented that map number 2 was just an improvement on map number 1.

Commissioner Morrow made a motion that the Board accepts Map No. 2. Commissioner Kendall seconded the motion for purposes of discussion. Commissioner Kendall stated he was prepared to vote; however, if Mr. McDaniel, Mrs. McDaniel and Mr. Massengale wanted some more time before making a decision, he was prepared to give them some more time. Commissioner Morrow stated that he could not be present on the 17th of December to vote. After some more discussion, Commissioner Kendall withdrew his second to the motion. Commissioner Morrow's motion died for lack of a second.

County Manager Wilson wanted to know if any of the commissioners were going to draw a map as we will need to start over with public hearings, etc. He said to try and schedule an appointment with the reapportionment office in December was going to be hard to do. Commissioner Kendall commented that he was going to go up and do some improvements to map number 4 since the Board feels the consensus is not to have a retrogressive map.

Motion made by Commissioner Kendall to table until December 17th. Commissioner Morrow cannot be present that date; therefore Commissioner Kendall withdrew his motion. There was some discussion about having a special called meeting and the possible dates for it.

Motion made by Commissioner Martha McDaniel to have a special called meeting on Thursday, December 20, 2001 at 5:00 p.m. to vote on a map. Commissioner Kendall seconded the motion and motion was approved by a vote of 4-1 with Commissioner Morrow voting against the motion.

XII. REPORT OF COUNTY MANAGER

County Manager Wilson reminded the Board that they had decided to have both the Extraordinary Session and Public Hearing on Zoning on December 17, 2001. The Commissioners Meeting would be held at 5:00 P.M. and the Public Hearing would begin at 6:00 P.M.

County Manager Wilson announced that Dr. Bradley has invited the Board and staff, if interested, to attend a presentation by Dr. Douglas Bachtel to the School Board on demographic studies for Spalding County. The meeting will be in the School Board Meeting Room December 13, 2001 at 7:00 P.M.

XIII. REPORT OF COMMISSIONERS

Commissioner Kendall asked County Manager Wilson if we were close in scheduling a meeting of the Sewer Task Force to discuss NAACP sewer request. Mr. Wilson stated that a tentative date of December 19, 2001 at 5:30 was trying to be set up but he had to confirm it with W.L. Jorden representatives.

Commissioner Johnie McDaniel had no comments.

Commissioner Martha McDaniel complimented staff on the blue sheets in the packet and commented they were very helpful.

Commissioner Morrow had no comments.

Commissioner Massengale had no comments.
