The Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia, held their regular monthly meeting on Monday, June 3, 2002 in their office in the Courthouse Annex in the City of Griffin, Spalding County, Georgia, beginning at 6:00 o'clock p.m. with Commissioners Martha McDaniel, Merrill Massengale, Dick Morrow, Johnie McDaniel and Michael Kendall present. Also present were County Manager William Wilson, Assistant County Manager Michael Sabine, County Attorney Jim Fortune and County Clerk Phyllis Doane.

IV. PRESENTATIONS/PROCLAMATIONS/RECOGNITION

1. Consider approval of a Proclamation proclaiming Saturday, June 15, 2002 as “Gary Reid Day in Spalding County”. Mr. Reid was present to receive this Proclamation from Chairman McDaniel.

Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel the following Proclamation was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.

Proclamation

HONORING THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF FORMER COUNTY COMMISSIONER GARY REID

WHEREAS, Gary Reid is a Spalding County native, born January 12, 1932 in Griffin at 414 East Solomon Street, son of the late Vera and Walter Reid; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Reid graduated from Fairmont High School in 1950 and subsequently served his community and nation as a paratrooper in the Korean Conflict; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Reid has continued his service to the community through membership in numerous organizations over the years, including the American Legion Post 8480, St. Stephens Episcopal Church and St. George's Episcopal Church, the Civic Improvement League and Citizens Improvement League, as well as the Griffin-Spalding Chamber of Commerce and the Griffin-Spalding County Development Authority; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Reid also served as President of the Griffin branch of the NAACP as well as acting as the catalyst for the creation of single-member county commission districts in Spalding County, serving as the first African-American county commissioner in County history; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Reid has served as an inspiration for Spalding County, as he has sought to expand political participation and representation of African-Americans in their local government, thereby extending the reach of our democratic ideals.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia that Saturday, June 15, 2002 is hereby proclaimed as

“GARY REID DAY IN SPALDING COUNTY”

and encourages all citizens of Spalding County to reflect upon the importance of the contributions of Gary Reid in securing the civil rights for all Spalding Countians.

1. *Consider approval of the minutes of the Extraordinary Session of May 20, 2002 and Zoning Public Hearing of May 23, 2002. Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel the minutes were unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.*

IX. CONSENT AGENDA

Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel Items 1 and 2 on the Consent Agenda were unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.

THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF SPALDING COUNTY, GEORGIA

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Georgia is empowered by virtue of its police power to regulate the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Spalding County to provide for and enact zoning and developmental regulations;

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia enacted the current Zoning Ordinance of Spalding County, Georgia on January 4, 1994 and therein adopted the Official Zoning Map of Spalding County, Georgia, in Article 23, Section 2301, et. seq.;

WHEREAS, under the Zoning Ordinance of Spalding County, Georgia and the Official Zoning Map of Spalding County, Georgia the within described property is currently classified under the zoning classification entitled "AR-1, Agricultural and Residential;"

WHEREAS, B. D. Luke and Naomi J. Luke applicant, applied for a change in zoning classification to be applied to the within described property to "AR-2, Rural Reserve;"

WHEREAS, such application was filed with Spalding County, Georgia on March 28, 2002;

WHEREAS, such application was reviewed by the Spalding County Planning Commission, and a hearing on the application was conducted by the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia on May 23, 2002, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 33-66-1, et. seq. in the Spalding County Hearing Room, Room 108, Spalding County Courthouse Annex, 119 East Solomon Street, Griffin, Spalding County, Georgia;

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia considered the proposed amendment, any and all alternate proposals or amendments, the report of the Spalding County Planning Commission and all data and evidence taken at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed by the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia that an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance of Spalding County, Georgia and an amendment to the Official Zoning Map of Spalding County, Georgia is in conformance with the Spalding County Comprehensive Plan and sound comprehensive planning principles and of substantial benefit to the public and in the promotion of the best interests and general welfare of the people;

NOW THEREFORE, IT SHALL BE AND IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia, that the Zoning Ordinance of Spalding County, Georgia and the Official Zoning Map of Spalding County, Georgia shall be and are hereby amended as follows:

Section 1: The Zoning Ordinance of Spalding County, Georgia and the Official Zoning Map of Spalding County, Georgia designating the boundaries of the several types or classes of zoning districts shall be, and is hereby amended so as to change the zoning classification applicable to the following described property:

All that tract or parcel of land lying and being in Land Lots 11 & 22 of the 4th Land District of Spalding County, Georgia and being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the Southerly right-of-way of Ellis Road (80' R/W) said point being South 88 degrees 20 minutes 58 seconds East, a distance of 855.83 feet as measured from the centerline intersection of Ellis Road and Crabtree Road; thence along said right-of-way North 88 degrees 43 minutes 35 seconds East, a distance of 1020.00 feet to a point; thence leaving said right-of-way South 01 degrees 16 minutes 25 seconds East, a distance of 114.03 feet to a point; thence in a curvature, said curve having an arc length of 62.87 feet, a radius of 220.00 feet, a chord bearing of South 09 degrees 27 minutes 37 seconds East, and a chord distance of 62.65 feet to a point; thence South 17 degrees 38 minutes 48 seconds East, a distance of 126.72 feet to a point; thence in a curvature, said

curve having an arc length of 82.98 feet, a radius of 280.00 feet, a chord bearing of South 09 degrees 09 minutes 24 seconds East, and a chord distance of 82.68 feet to a point; thence South 00 degrees 40 minutes 00 seconds East, a distance of 1325.46 feet to a point; thence South 58 degrees 51 minutes 00 seconds East, a distance of 1388.34 feet to a point; thence South 00 degrees 05 minutes 51 seconds West, a distance of 939.48 feet to a point; thence South 82 degrees 10 minutes 40 seconds West, a distance of 2264.78 feet to a point; thence North 00 degrees 40 minutes 00 seconds West, a distance of 3647.01 feet to the **POINT OF BEGINNING**. Said tract containing 125.731 acres.

From “AR-1, Agricultural and Residential” to “AR-2, Rural Reserve” District.

Section 2: Pursuant to the authority granted to it by virtue of the Zoning Ordinance of Spalding County, Georgia, Section 414 (L) and upon a determination by the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia that application of certain conditions on the amendment benefit the public and promote the best interests of the general welfare of the people, the following conditions shall be imposed upon the amendment to the Zoning Ordinance of Spalding County, Georgia and the Official Zoning Map of Spalding County, Georgia, as follows:

- a. All homes shall have a minimum heated area of 2,000 square feet.
- b. Zoning approval should be conditioned on the proposed site plan

Section 3:

(a) Pursuant to the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance of Spalding County, Georgia, section 2302 (B), the Official Zoning Map of Spalding County, Georgia shall be amended to reflect the change made hereby to read as follows:

On June 3, 2002, by official action of the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia the following change was made in the Official Zoning Map, Spalding County: All those tracts or parcels of land situate lying and being in Land Lot(s) 11 & 22 of the 4th Land District of Spalding County, Georgia, consisting of approximately 125.731 acres, zoned AR-2, Conditional.

(b) The Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of Spalding County, Georgia is directed and authorized to execute such notice of the amendment of the Official Zoning Map of Spalding County, Georgia.

(c) The Zoning Administrator is authorized and directed to enter such notice of the amendment of the Official Zoning Map of Spalding County, GA thereon.

Section 4: The foregoing amendment of the Zoning Ordinance of Spalding County, Georgia shall become effective immediately upon adoption of this resolution.

Section 5: All Ordinances or resolutions in conflict herewith shall be and are hereby repealed.

2. **Lift from the table.** Consider appointment to the Department of Family and Children Services Board of Directors to fill a vacancy created by the retirement of Mr. Ralph Griffin.

Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel the item was lifted from the table by a unanimous vote of 5-0.

Chairman McDaniel stated that three (3) names had been entered into the Appointment Book for this appointment. Commissioner Martha McDaniel nominated Rosa Stewart, Director of United Way. Commissioner Massengale nominated Robert McIntyre, retired from Northwest Air Lines and Johnie McDaniel nominated Dr. Scott Rowlette, who is pastor of Vineyard Baptist Church. It has been confirmed that Dr. Rowlette’s address is outside of Spalding County; therefore, he will not be eligible to serve.

Chairman McDaniel asked for votes for Rosa Stewart. Ms. Stewart received the votes of Commissioners Martha McDaniel, Johnie McDaniel and Michael Kendall. **Ms. Rosa Stewart** by acclamation is to be the appointment for the Spalding County Department of Family and Children Services Board of Directors. Term to expire June 30, 2007.

XI. NEW BUSINESS

1. Consider recommendation from HDR/WL Jordan to award the WTOP Phase VIII Lake Restoration Project to low bidder Hill Construction Co. in the amount of \$153,656. Budgeted amount \$150,000. *Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel award of low bid of Hill Construction was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0. Reference Contract #2002-06-03 (A).*

2. Consider recommendation from HDR/WL Jordan to award the WTOP Phase IV Picnic Pavilion Parking Lot Project to low bidder Hill Construction Co. in the amount of \$149,804.70. Budgeted amount \$150,000. *Upon motion by Commissioner Martha McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Morrow award of low bid of Hill Construction was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0. Reference Contract #2002-06-03 (B).*

3. Consider Renewal Agreement with Department of Family and Children Services for Janitorial Services for FY 2003. This is to begin July 1, 2002 and end June 30, 2003 at the monthly rate of \$650.00/month. *Upon motion by Commissioner Martha McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Morrow Renewal Agreement was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.*

4. Consider Contract with Law Firm of Sullivan, Sturdivant and Ogletree, P.C. for the Provision of Indigent Defense Attorney Services for Spalding County. *Upon motion by Commissioner Martha McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Morrow the following Contract was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.*

CONTRACT FOR THE PROVISION OF INDIGENT DEFENSE ATTORNEY SERVICES FOR SPALDING COUNTY

This agreement is entered into between Spalding County, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, hereinafter referred to as "the County", and the Law Firm of Sullivan, Sturdivant and Ogletree, P.C., hereinafter referred to as "the Law Firm".

For and in consideration of the mutual benefits flowing to the parties hereto, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

-1-

Spalding County will hire the Law Firm to provide an Indigent Defense Program for Spalding County. The term of this Agreement shall be for a five (5) year period beginning on July 1, 2002 and continuing until the 30th day of June, 2007, at which time it shall terminate. Either party hereto may terminate this contract for convenience upon giving three hundred sixty five (365) days written notice to the opposite party.

Each party hereto may terminate the contract for cause thirty (30) days after notice of default is given to the opposite party and the default is not cured within thirty days from notice.

DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

The Law Firm will provide all the indigent criminal defense services for the State, Superior and Juvenile Courts of Spalding County, Georgia. In regards to Juvenile Court, defense services shall be limited to delinquency matters and deprivation actions brought by the

Spalding County Department of Family and Children Services. If a defendant is indigent as defined by Georgia law, because of his or her financial condition, then legal services will be provided under this contract. In determining indigent status, the administrator secretary responsible for all indigent applications, will conduct a background check on all applicants to confirm and verify the accuracy and truthfulness of the information provided. If a Defendant is determined to be indigent, then services will be provided. This contract expressly excludes any indigent defense services in capital murder cases. The lump sum compensation provided for by this contract shall have no application in capital murder cases.

LEGAL CONFLICTS

If the Law Firm has a legal conflict with providing defense to an indigent criminal defendant, then it shall be the Law Firm's responsibility to employ competent and experienced outside counsel to represent the criminal defendant. Fees for the outside counsel will be borne by the Law Firm from the contract fees already attached hereto. Spalding County will not be required to make any additional payments whatsoever for outside counsel in the event of a legal conflict.

COMPENSATION

The County agrees to pay to the Law Firm the following compensation for rendering the services described herein.

Year 1	July 1, 2002- June 30, 2003	\$615,000
Year 2	July 1, 2003- June 30, 2004	\$635,000
Year 3	July 1, 2004- June 30, 2005	\$655,000
Year 4	July 1, 2005- June 30, 2006	\$675,000
Year 5	July 1, 2006- June 30, 2007	\$695,000

Spalding County will pay the above sums to the Law Firm in advance in twelve equal monthly installments. The invoice from the Law Firm must be received by Spalding County not later than the twenty fifth (25th) of the month previous to the month to be paid and, if received by that date, Spalding County will pay same by the fifth (5th) day of the current month. That is to say, as an example, an invoice for the month of August, 2002 must be received by Spalding County not later than July 25, 2002 and it will be paid by the County not later than August 5, 2002.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Nothing herein shall be construed to make the Law Firm the employee of Spalding County. The only relationship created by this contract shall be that of independent contractor. All parties to this contract will comply fully with all Federal, State and Local laws and regulations.

-6-

INDEMNIFICATION

Law Firm agrees to hold Spalding County harmless against the claims of any third parties, which may arise out of the performance of this contract or of any duty or obligation under this contract.

-7-

INSURANCE

The Law Firm shall provide its own malpractice insurance with an insurance company licensed to do business in the State of Georgia. Said policy shall provide minimum liability coverage of \$1,000,000 per claim.

-8-

EXPENSES TO BE PAID BY THE COUNTY

During the performance of their duties as public defenders, lawyers will incur certain expenses that shall be reimbursed by the County. These expenses include transcription cost, cost incurred in reproducing files, interpreter costs, subpoena of documents cost, medical records cost and forensic's cost, expert witness fee, C.P.O. attendance cost, photograph developing, shipping costs and special process service.

SEVERABILITY

If for any reason, any paragraph or other portion of this document is deemed inapplicable, invalid or unconstitutional for any reason, the other portions of the aforesaid agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this Agreement under seal, by their duly authorized officers as of the date and year first written above.

5. Consider approval of final plat of Stonebriar Subdivision Phase I, located off Moreland Road and Carver Road. *Upon motion by Commissioner Martha McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Morrow final plat was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.*

6. Consider approval of final plat of Seven Forks Subdivision Phase II, located off Jason's Ridge. *Upon motion by Commissioner Martha McDaniel, seconded by Commissioner Massengale final plat was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.*

7. Consider acceptance of Right-of-Way Deed for Rockbridge Loop, Bramble Way, Marble Court, Ruby Way and Stonebriar Boulevard (Stonebriar Subdivision Phase I). *Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel Right-of-Way Deed was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.*

8. Consider acceptance of Right-of-Way Deed for Jason's Ridge (Seven Forks Subdivision Phase II). *Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel Right-of-Way Deed was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.*

9. Discuss July meeting dates. County Manager Wilson stated that the first reading of the budget will be Monday, June 17th and the second reading will be on Monday, July 1st, which is a regular meeting date unless the Board is interested in changing the July 1st meeting date since it is the week of the 4th. July 1 meeting date was not a problem for any of the Commissioners.

County Manager Wilson stated that Commissioner Martha McDaniel and Johnie McDaniel will be out of town on June 27th, which is the meeting date for their zoning hearing. He asked if the Board would like to change this meeting or leave the date alone. Assistant County Manager Sabine stated that this is a fairly light meeting and due to the fact that the dates have already been sent out, his preference would be to continue with the date if there will be a quorum present on the 27th.

XII. REPORT OF COUNTY MANAGER

County Manager Wilson stated that Jewell Walker-Harps had invited the Board to attend a luncheon honoring Former County Commissioner Gary Reid on Saturday, June 15, 2002. The luncheon would be held at VFW Post on N. Third Street and the cost of the luncheon ticket was \$30.00 each.

County Manager Wilson reported that a memo had been placed in the Commissioners' boxes regarding minimum lot size requirements for non-sewered areas in Spalding County. There is a conflict with minimum lot size in non-sewered areas and the Conservation Subdivision Ordinance. A modification would have to be made to the Conservation Subdivision Ordinance to correct this conflict.

County Manager Wilson announced that the Griffin Post Office would be having a ceremony Friday, June 7, 2002 at 10:00 a.m. at Spalding County Fire Department Headquarters, 600 Carver Road to kick off the Heroes of 2001 postage stamp. The Community is invited to this event.

County Manager Wilson reminded the Board that LOST renegotiations have to begin by June 30th and he had placed a memo in their boxes regarding the sequences and dates and this would be an item for discussion on the June 17th agenda.

County Manager Wilson brought up the present ordinance on brick mailboxes and asked the Board if there was any interest in modifying the ordinance to allow brick mailboxes on local and minor streets as defined in the UDO. County Attorney Fortune was directed to draw up a draft ordinance allowing any kind of mailbox

on local and minor streets in subdivisions as defined in the UDO. This will be an item on the June 17th agenda.

XIII. REPORT OF COMMISSIONERS

Commissioner Kendall announced to the Board that the Hospital Authority has hired United Bank to be the custodian of their \$32 Million funds. He said that the Authority got a very favorable rate for the first year.

Commissioner Kendall stated that the Hospital Authority has received a proposal from a particular entity in Spalding County and he would like some input from this Board. He said they are proposing to borrow some money somewhere between \$500,000 and \$750,000 at a below market interest rate loan and the Authority has not ever done this before. The Board asked Commissioner Kendall to send them a memo with some particulars regarding this loan request.

Commissioner Massengale stated that there were some bad potholes on County Line Church Road at the corner of Wildwood Road and asked County Manager Wilson to see that these were repaired. Also he asked Mr. Wilson to see that the repair work done on School Road be smoothed down where it would be level with the road.

Commissioner Martha McDaniel stated that she had had a citizen call her complaining about barking dogs and asked staff to get a copy of the Rockdale County Ordinance to see what they did. Mr. Wilson commented that he would get a copy and have it placed in each Commissioners' box.

Commissioner Morrow made comments about the Vietnam Wall Experience saying that he believes that this was the best event ever held in Spalding County. He publicly commended Rev. Turkett and everybody that worked to put on this event. He said that the Wall brought out tens of thousands of people and he witnessed extremely emotional displays as people came to the Wall. He said it was very therapeutic for a lot of folks. Commissioner Martha McDaniel also commented that a number of people came up to her and stated what a beautiful park Wyomia Tyus was as they had never visited up there. This event was great recognition for our Park.

Commissioner Morrow stated he had a letter from Mr. John McLean who had been made aware of the County's problem with filling positions in an article in the paper and recommended retired people to work part time.

Commissioner Morrow announced that the Long Range Planning Committee has an official name and the name is the Griffin/Spalding Renaissance 2020 Committee. He said that Wednesday they would be having a Steering Committee of which he is a member, and their task is to set down specific parts of the plan to be taken back to the full committee to be voted on. He said that he had recommended eight (8) items, one of which is the Kelsey Middle School situation. He said that he feels that the committee could use a bright college student off for the summer with writing skills to do some of this work.

Commissioner Johnnie McDaniel echoed what has been said tonight about the Vietnam Wall Experience. He said that it was also a good opportunity for a different generation or two generations who have not been touched at all to be able to maybe understand the magnitude of what happened.

Commissioner Johnnie McDaniel asked Mr. Wilson to pass on to Mr. Garner his compliments on taking care of a dangerous situation on Moose Lodge Road.

Commissioner Morrow also gave a special vote of thanks to Parks & Recreation Director Louis Greene and his crew who did a lot of fine work out at the Park for this Vietnam Wall event.

Upon motion by Commissioner Morrow, seconded by Commissioner Martha McDaniel the Board voted unanimously to go into a Closed Meeting.

XIV. CLOSED MEETING
