11. Projected voter turnout based on active voters: 65% (29,160 VOTERS)

Election Day polls are open from 7am – 7pm. Advance Voting site(s) open from 8am - 5pm. Sample ballots are available for viewing at the precincts and available on the county's website.

12. INFORMATION FOR VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT: Eligible voters have (2) ways to cast ballots prior to Election Day: Absentee by Mail and Advance (Early) Voting.

ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL

Eligible voters desiring to vote by mail may do so WITHOUT PROVIDING A REASON OR IDENTIFICATION. However, voters who registered for the first time in Georgia by mail and did not provide identification, will be required to provide at the time of voting, one of the six acceptable forms of PHOTO ID listed on page 3 or a copy of current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other governmental document that shows the name and address of the voter. **Those voters who do not have the proper form of identification can vote a Provisional Ballot.**

ABSENTEE BALLOTS WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR MAIL ON APRIL 1, 2020.

Voters may request an Absentee Ballot by mail beginning 180 days prior to any election. However, the last day an Absentee Ballot can be mailed is Friday, June 5, 2020.

WHAT TO INCLUDE IN THE BY- MAIL ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUEST

Voters may mail or fax a written request for an Absentee Ballot. The written request should include:

- Name and address as registered to vote
- Date of birth
- Election name and date (i.e. Election – June 9, 2020)
- Address where ballot is to be mailed
- Daytime contact or phone number
- Voter's written signature

WHERE TO RECEIVE AND SEND THE ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUEST

Voters may also contact our office to have an Absentee Ballot Application mailed to them. You can also download an Absentee Ballot application from the web at <http://www.spaldingcounty.com/voting-in-spalding-county.php>.

ACCEPTABLE PHOTO IDENTIFICATION FOR VOTING

Acceptable forms of **Photo Identification** are:

1. A Georgia Driver's License (even if expired or suspended);
2. Valid State or Federal Government photo ID;
3. Valid US Passport with photo;
4. Valid Government Employee photo ID (City, County, State or US Government)
5. Valid US Military photo ID
6. Tribal photo ID
7. Weapons permit w/photo

For voting purposes only, a voter who does not have any of the above photo IDs may obtain a Voter Identification Card at NO COST upon providing that they are a Georgia voter, from the Spalding County Elections and Registrar Office or the Department of Driver Services.

14. **OBSERVATION OF COUNT:** On Election Night, the public may observe the tabulation of votes at the Elections Office, 825 Memorial Drive, Griffin GA 30223: (770) 467-4245.

15. **PROVISIONAL VOTES:** Will be tabulated the Friday after the Election Day.

VOTER'S CHECKLIST – Things to Do before Election Day

1. Confirm the status of your registration at least 4 weeks prior to the date of the election. Update your registration information, such as address and name. How? Contact the Elections Office at 770-467-4245 or inquire at <https://www.sos.ga.gov> and then go to my voter page.
2. Know how and when to apply for an Absentee Ballot if you are unable to vote in person at your polling place on Election Day or during the Advance Voting period.
3. Know the voter identification requirements before you attempt to vote.
4. Know which polling place you are assigned to and how to get there.
5. Familiarize yourself with the voting device used. Learn how the device is accessible to voters with disabilities.
6. Learn who can assist in voting and who can receive assistance.
7. Know what time the polls open and close; (7am until 7pm)
